Public Policy is the solution of societal problems.



Policy evaluation refers to the scientific and empirically based assessment of the design, implementation and effectiveness of public policies, be they measures, programs or projects.

What does that have to do with methods?

Four arguments



- We need a smart set of criteria to define whether policy is good or bad.



- We need sound methods of data collection to measure our phenomena of interest.



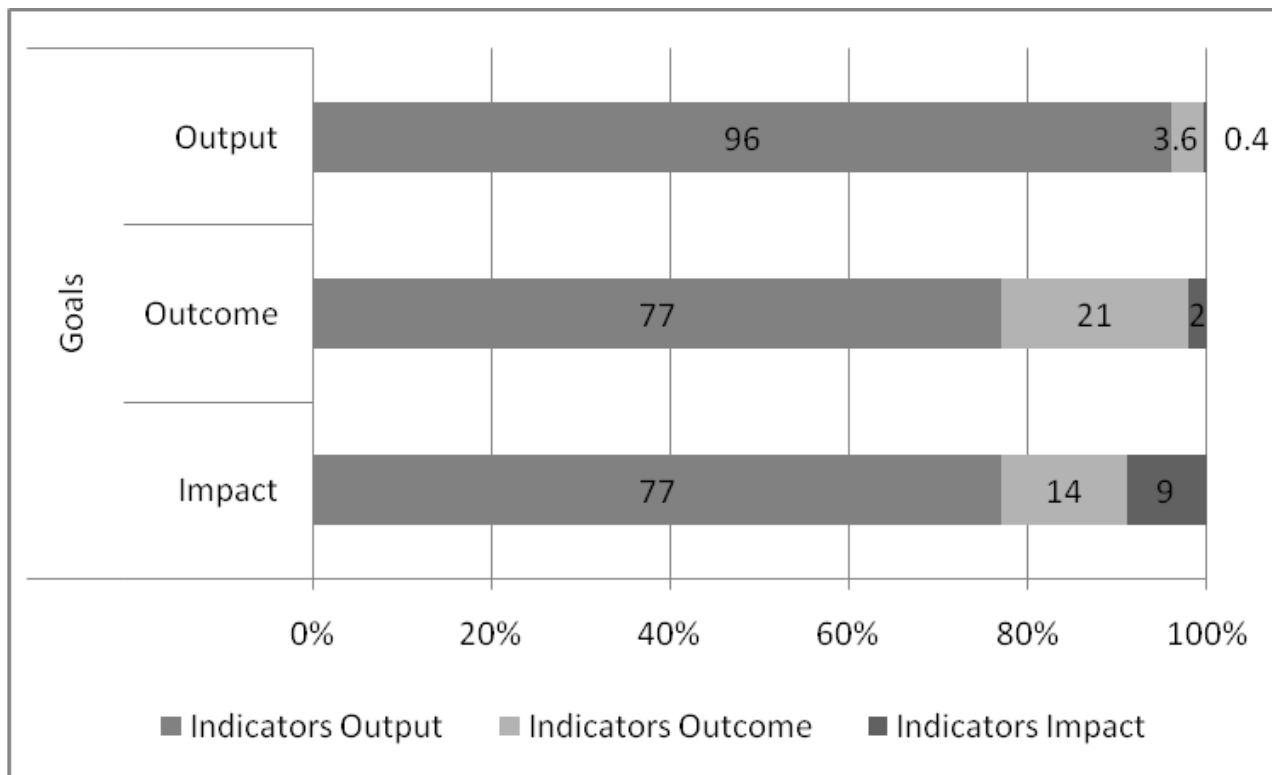
- We need a realistic concept of causality to link interventions and effects.



- We need appropriate methods of data analysis to do justice to our normative and causal models.

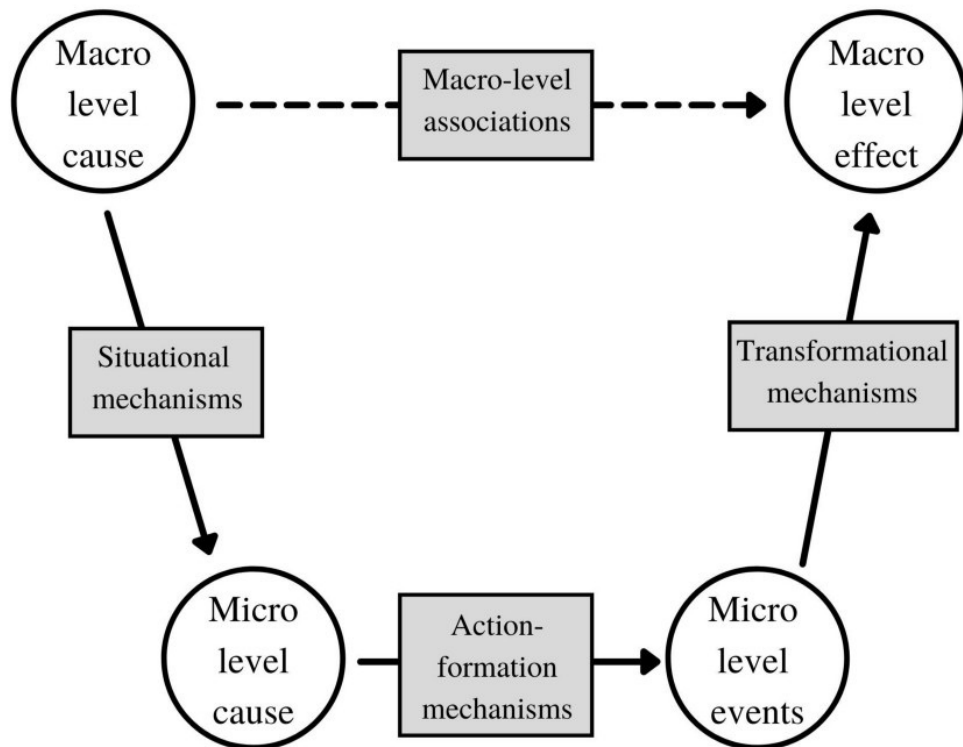

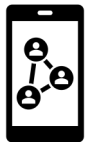
- Be serious
