


Introduction – Topics and public policies...

- 1. We SAIs are at the same time the mandator and the mandatee...
- 2. Choosing a topic by evaluations or performance audits measuring impacts: a great privilege, but also a great responsibility.
- 3. WGEPPP... Public Policies and Programs Both: evaluation but also performance audit measuring impacts outside of the administration.
- 4. The field of possible topics by **public policies and programs** is huge!
- 5. Public policies involve often many agencies.
- 6. Our main suspicion is that a policy is not achieving its objectives, i.e.
 - that its effects are not reaching those for whom it is intended or
 - or that it is costing too much in relation to its results.

But what is a public policy?

A set of coherent decisions taken by an institutional player and implemented by a network of players with the aim of guiding the behaviour of a target population so that a problem that society is no longer able to manage can be resolved by a collective effort.



Programs concerns measures that are a more concrete than a policy, but it's difficult to distinguish between the two notions!
